### To Hold Fine Program; Prominent Speakers, Miss Wisconsin Here

LADIES PROGRAM, CROWNING OF QUEEN, HOME TALENT SHOW, FREE DAIRY LUNCH, EXHIBITS, \$550 IN PRIZES, FREE MOVIES ALL PART OF PROGRAM

The second annual Kewaskum Dairy Day event will be held this Saturday, Mar. 19, in the high school gymnasium and agriculture department. Sponsored by the Kewaskum Business association, an excellent program has been arranged. Exhibits by the various businessmen will be open at 11 a. m., and a free dairy lunch will be served starting at 12 noon. The formal program will get underway at 1:15 p. m. with music by the high school band and will continue throughout the afternoon and evening.

On the afternoon program will be a review of the farming situation in Washington county by County Agent M. J. Hovland. This will be followed by a discussion on the farm and small business tax situation by Senator Frank E. Panzer of Dodge and Washington counties. He will be followed by a discussion of potential agricultural programs by Representative William K. Van Felt of the 6th congressional district. During the afternoon a program will also be given for the ladies in the high school cafeteria, including a food demonstration, style and dress revue.

Following songs by the high school chorus at 7:15 p. m., the evening program will get underway at 7:30 o'clock with a discussion, "Russian Agriculture," by Milo Swanton of the Wisconsin Council of Agriculture. "Miss Wisconsin," who is Mary Alice Fox of Sheboygan, will be on the program during the afternoon and evening and will crown Kewaskum's new dairy queen. A home talent program will be conducted, Kiwanis club conservation awards will be presented, the village and Businessmen's association presidents will speak briefly, and there will be numerous exhibits by businessmen of Kewaskum for the entire public to see.

A free noon lunch, over 50 prizes valued at over \$650.00 to be given away, and a look at Washington county dairying are all a part of this program. Free movies will be shown at 1:15 p. m. for the youngsters at the Kewaskum theatre.

### Family Flees As Fire Destroys Town Wayne Farm Residence

In an early morning fire Wednesday, flames completely destroyed the farm home in which a town of Wayne family of five was living on Hwys. 28 and W several miles west of Kewaskum. The family escaped uninjured by fleeing the burning residence but all of their belongings were lost.

The dwelling which burned to the ground was occupied by the Donald Schickert family and the blaze was discovered by Mr. Schickert at about 5 a. m. when he woke up and smelled smoke. He awakened his wife and three sons, Norman, 11; Stephen, 2, and Jackie, 1, who fled from the house. Schickert then drove to the home of a neighbor, Jerome Mayer, and called the Kewaskum fire department at about 5:30 a. m.

As he sped to the neighbor's home, Schickert attracted the attention of Mayer and other neighbors by blowing his car horn. Mayer and Ralph and Leonard Peter, who live nearby, rushed to the Schickert home to assist in attempts to save personal belongings but only a few pieces could be saved before the flames and smoke prevented them from entering the

house. Saved were a sofa, TV set and wash machine.

When local firemen arrived the entire roof of the dwelling was already enveloped in flames. The fire had gained such headway that the home could not be saved and firemen stood by to prevent the fire from spreading to neighboring farm buildings. Luckily the wind was from the northeast and other farm buildings were not endangered. It is believed that the blaze apparently started from a defective chimney and ignited the upper story and roof. The Kewaskum firemen remained at the scene a couple of hours.

The Schickert family was asleep on the first floor and apparently did not notice the fire until it had already gained considerable headway. The farm and buildings, owned by Walter Theusch, are insured but it was stated that none of the Schickerts' personal belongings or furnishings were insured.

The family is staying temporarily at the home of Mrs. Schickert's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Anton Wondra at Theresa, until they can obtain other living quarters.






