## School Debate Team Successful in Meets At Menasha, West Allis

The Kewaskum High school debate team entered two tournaments this month and was fairly successful in both.

At Menasha on Dec. 2, the team had a 4-2 record. Kewaskum was represented by Walborg Petterson and Dawn Martin, debating together for the first time on the affirmative side. They defeated Kimberly but lost to New London and Two Rivers for a 1-2 record. On the negative side were Ralph Albrecht and Richard Groh, who defeated Port Washington, Kaukana and New London for a winning 3-0 record. With their 4-2 record, the team tied for second place in class B debate. Sheboygan South took first place in all three classes.

At West Allis on the following Saturday, Dec. 9, the team had a 3-3 record. They were in competition with 39 other teams in Class B. On the affirmative side were Mariel Seefeldt and Pauline Battaglia, who also debated together for the first time. They defeated Menomonee Falls but lost to Port Washington and West Bend. The Village Board of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin, met in regular monthly session with President Reigle presiding and all board members present.

Preceding the regular board meeting the public hearing on the proposed 1962 budget was held. Since no one appeared and since there were no objections to the budget, as previously published, the budget hearing was declared closed.

The minutes of the previous meetings were approved as presented upon motion by Trustee Merwin, seconded by Trustee Geidel and duly carried.

The proposed 1962 budget was again reviewed and the following resolutions were presented:



With Larson missing from the lineup, Mayville was able to give Kewaskum a close run. The Chevs took the lead and held it during the contest but their opponents remained right on their heels. Kewaskum was on top 22-18 at the quarter but Mayville narrowed the gap to 37-36 at halftime. The Chevs went ahead by six, 54-48, at the third period's end but again Mayville closed the distance to three points, 72-69, at the end.

Kewaskum's top offensive guns and leading scorers in the win were Don Meisenheimer and Al Tennies with 21 and 20 points respectively. Augie Bilgo contributed 11 points, Frank Krueger 10 and Otto Ramthun 9. These five scored all but one of their team's points. Leading scorers for Mayville were T.

Bartelt with 17, Genzmer 13 and Aimmer 12.

The Chevs face another strong test this Saturday night when they play at West Bend. The Lithias have won two out of three to date.
