Missionary to Appear At St. Lucas Church

Richard W. Mueller, who has served in the Wisconsin Ev. Lutheran Synod mission fields in northern Rhodesia for the past five years, is scheduled to present a slide lecture of his work at St. Lucas Lutheran church, Kewaskum, on May 27, at 8:00 p. m.

The Rev. Mr. Mueller was ordained into the ministry in June of 1954 as pastor of Grace Lutheran church, Crivitz, Wis. Previously he had attended Northwestern College, Watertown, Wis., and the Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary at Mequon, Wis.

In January of 1957 Pastor Mueller accepted the call as missionary to Northern Rhodesia, Africa. Since then he has served in and around the capital city of Lusaka, Northern Rhodesia.

The missionary returned to the states for a furlough in December of 1961 and intends to return to Africa in September.

Pastor Mueller, the son of Pastor and Mrs. R. W. Mueller of Jefferson, Wis., is married and the father of four children.

Residents of Kewaskum and community will again have an opportunity to participate in the annual tribute to the nation's dead of all wars when a Memorial Day parade and services, sponsored by Robert G. Romaine American Legion Post No. 384, will be held in the village on Wednesday morning, May 30.

The parade will begin promptly at 9:15 a. m. and will form at the new high school grounds. Flags for all marching children will be distributed before the parade. The parade will proceed south on Billgo lane to First st., then east to Park View dr. south to Main st., west on Main to Fond du Lac ave., and north to Fond du Lac to the Legion Memorial building.

DOG NOTICE






