Farm Home Near St. Kilian Destroyed By Fire Christmas Night

The former George Zehren farm homestead, now owned by the Donald Wendt family, about a half mile west of St. Kilian in the town of Wayne was destroyed by fire on Christmas night. The Wendt family was not at home at the time but arrived some time later. They had been visiting relatives for Christmas.

The blaze was noticed by Neal Straub of Kewaskum, a fire department member, who saw the fire from Hwy. 28, some distance from the farm home. He drove to St. Kilian and reported the blaze. From there the Kewaskum fire department was summoned shortly before 7 p. m.

With no one at home at the time, the fire had a good start before it was discovered. When firemen arrived the roof and interior of the house were already in flames and the blaze was out of control. The entire residence was destroyed as the fire had gained such headway that neither the building nor any of the furnishings could be saved. The firemen fought the fire for a good three hours in bitter cold and succeeded in saving a nearby barn.

The Kohlsville fire department was also called later to stand by so that the Kewaskum firemen could return to their station about 10 p. m. Cause of the fire was not determined but it is believed to have started in the kitchen of the dwelling.

Mrs. Wendt is the No. 2 county nurse for Washington county.

Chevs Lose Again at Beaver Dam, 81-68

After winning their first three games in the Land o' Lakes league, the Kewaskum Chevrolets lost their second in succession at Beaver Dam Sunday night, where they were downed, 81-68, by a pretty good Beaver Dam team. The loss gave them a 3-2 record and dropped the team farther down in the standings.

Kewaskum fell behind in the initial period but narrowed the gap to 34-27 at halftime, which was the closest they come to catching the winners.

Gene Pieper, who has been improving fast, and playing some of the best ball on the team of late, paced the Chevs in the second quarter surge and led the losers in scoring with 17 points. Don Meisenheimer was next with 14. Top point men were Peterson and Miller of the winners with 22 and 19 points respectively.

League leading Menomonee Falls made it five wins in succession Saturday night when they easily beat West Bend, 113-65. Kewaskum's setback dropped them to fifth place.

The Chevs should regain their winning ways this Sunday night when they travel to Hustisford, whose tailenders have lost six straight without a victory. In other tilts to be played Saturday night West Bend entertains Cedarburg, Beaver Dam goes to Menomonee Falls in the feature game to settle first place, and Horicon is at Wauertown.




