## Firemen's Picnic This Weekend to Feature Huge Parade With 5 Bands, 2 Drum and Bugle Corps, Many Floats

**WATER FIGHTS, MODERNAIRES, FREE ENTERTAINMENT ACTS AMONG OTHER ATTRACTIONS**

Kewaskum's annual firemen's picnic will be held this week end, on Saturday evening, July 11, and Sunday afternoon and evening, July 12, in the village park. This year's picnic, and especially the huge parade on Sunday, will be the biggest and best ever held. Large crowds are expected.

Highlighting the big parade starting at 12:30 p. m. sharp, will be five bands and two drum and bugle corps. Bands will include the famous Milwaukee Continental Cadette band, Sheboyganites band, Washington High school

band of Germantown, Washington High school cadet band of Germantown, and leading the parade our own Kewaskum Community High school band. Drum and bugle corps will be the K. Y. Warriors of Oshkosh and the Marquis drum and bugle corps of Fond du Lac. Other musical groups, some of them on floats, will also participate.

Other features in the parade will be the Watertown Twirlettes baton twirlers, numerous beautiful floats entered by local businessmen, visiting fire departments and American Legion posts, comedy entries, old cars, many horses, many children's specialties, scouts, 4-H clubs, organizations, individuals and a large number of other units.

Over \$100 in prize money will be awarded to the best floats, children's specialties, etc. All children participating in the parade will be given tickets good in trade in the park. The Kewaskum picnic is noted for its fine parade and this will be the longest and most colorful held. The Milwaukee Cadette band and others participating will play in the park immediately following the parade.

Music by The Modernaires will be the attraction on Saturday evening and is sure to please those attending. All of the rides, refreshment, concession and amusement stands will be in operation.

Free entertainment acts will be provided Sunday afternoon and again in the evening. They will feature Bill King and Jackie, comedians and jugglers, a featured act with the "Spike Jones Show" for 10 years. If it's comedy and skilled juggling you want, this is the act, one of the most outstanding and unique in the entertainment world today. The juggling will be with battle axes, stick and ball, 7 way combination, top hat and three balls, 2 balls while eating apple, and a finale

of juggling 13 pieces and live fire. Another act will be the Bakers with artistry in puppetry, who will present lifelike marionettes on their portable stage with scenery and special lighting. The puppets will include can-can girls, Charleston dancers, hula-hula girls, a trained elephant, girl contortionist, girl on the trapeze, 2 dancing skeletons, do-do ballerina, line of 8 harem dancers and burlesque queen (for adults).

The popular water fights will again be held at 6:30 p. m. Sunday with several firemen teams from neighboring departments battling it out for cash money. Winners of the first two fights will face each other for the championship.

There will be rides for the kiddies, games, amusements and a variety of refreshments, including those big, juicy hamburgers and bratwurst. Fun and entertainment will be provided for all. Admission and parking are free. Don't miss this annual event.

## Henry P. Johnson, Mrs. F. Hron Die

Henry P. Johnson, 77, of Campbellsport, former farmer of the town of Ashford for 20 years, and member of the Fond du Lac county board, died at St. Agnes hospital, Fond du Lac, at 12:15 a. m. on Thursday, July 2. He had been in the hospital since Monday.

Mr. Johnson was born Nov. 21, 1886, in Tracy, Minn., a son of the late Thomas L. Johnson and Mary Ellen Curran. He came to Wisconsin at the age of nine years and farmed in the town of Ashford until he moved to Campbellsport in 1954. His marriage to Estelle Klotz took place Nov. 15, 1911, at St. Matthew's church, Campbellsport, and they celebrated their golden wedding anniversary in 1961.

Mr. Johnson was a member of the Knights of Columbus of the Fond du Lac Council, having received his 25-year pin several years ago.

## Businessmen to Sponsor Krazy Daze Street Sale Next Wednesday, July 15

### Nine Hurt in Three Crashes

Janet Coughlin, 3, of Wheaton, Ill., suffered a laceration to her right thigh when a car driven by Betty C. Coughlin, 36, also of Wheaton, went out of control as she was about to pass another vehicle on Hwy. 41 about .6 of a mile south of Hwy. 28 and rolled over. A house trailer attached to the car tipped on its side. The mishap occurred at 7:40 p. m. Sunday. The injured girl was removed to St. Joseph's Community hospital, West Bend, in the Kewaskum firemen's ambulance.

Roger Pieper, Campbellsport, and Elroy Voigt, Eden, were injured in a crash at about 1 a. m. Sunday on Hwy. V about three miles north of Kewaskum at the Roger Schleif farm. Their auto, traveling north, went out of control, skidded along the shoulder of the highway, tore off several lengths of metal guard rail and landed in a ditch, facing south. The car caught fire and the Campbellsport fire department was called to put out the blaze. The two injured young men were removed to St. Joseph's Community hospital, West Bend, in the Kewaskum firemen's ambulance.

Six persons, four of them young West Bend residents, were injured in a two car collision at 10:05 p. m. last Wednesday when a car, which was being pursued by West Bend police, skidded on the wet pavement on Hwy. 45 about a half mile south of West Bend and collided with an approaching vehicle. The accident occurred when an auto operated by David P. Landdeck, 18, West Bend, traveling south, apparently skidded when he attempted to pass another auto and spun around and collided with a car driven by Ruben C. Benicke, 56, of R. 1, Kewaskum, which was traveling north on Hwy. 45. Charges of driving too fast for conditions against Landdeck are pending. Injured in the crash were Loretta Benicke, 50, cut on the forehead and possible neck injury; Gloria Benicke, 16, leg injury and cuts; Jeanne Roemer, 14, West Bend, face lacerations; Carolyn Rehm, 14, West Bend, possible skull fracture; Kris Russell, 15, West Bend, multiple lacerations and David P. Landdeck, 18, West Bend, multiple lacerations. All of the injured were taken to St. Joseph's Community hospital, West Bend.
