Dick Cooke Opens Convenient Food Store at Rosenheimer's

Leases Food Dept. To Provide New Shopping Center

ROSENHEIMERS CONTINUE DEPARTMENT STORE, MILL

Another business transition has taken place in our steadily growing little city.

After 93 years of continuous service in the food business, the L. Rosenheimer Department Store has leased its food department to Richard "Dick" Cooke of West Bend to be operated as a Convenient Food Store. Cooke took over the business on Monday, Oct. 9.

The new owner will provide the community with a completely new, more efficient and most Convenient Food Store, without interruption of service. In the very near future a complete remodeling of the entire department store and food store will take place to provide this area with a much improved one-stop shopping center offering super savings.

Cooke is a former resident of Kewaskum and is known by many people here. He was formerly employed at the Stellpflug Meat Market in Kewaskum for two years and when John Stellpflug discontinued his market here to open a super market at New Holstein, Cooke accompanied him and was employed there for four years. For the past year Cooke has owned a Convenient Food Store in West Bend which he will continue to own and operate along with his local store. He is experienced in the food business.

The feature about Convenient Food Stores is that they are open every day and night until midnight, including Sundays. At present the local store will be open daily from 8 a. m. to 5:30 p. m. and Fridays until 9 p. m. but in the near future after the transition period and remodeling is completed it will also remain open nights. The store will also continue its daily deliveries at 4 p. m.

Rosenheimers will continue to operate their department store and feed mill as in the past. They wish to thank their many customers and friends who have been loyal food patrons throughout the years and hope they will continue to patronize the new owner in the future.

N. Fondy Shades Indians, 13-6, in Homecoming

GRAFTON TIPS PEWAUKEE TO TAKE OVER SOLE LEAD

A complete lack of scoring punch near the goal line by the Indians allowed North Fondy to hold them off and gain a 13-6 victory to spoil Kewaskum's homecoming Friday. The set-back dropped the Indians to a four-way tie for fifth place as well as last place.

Four goal line stands by North Fondy, including two in the final quarter, saddled the Indians with the loss. Kewaskum reached the Orioles' 4 yard line on one fourth quarter drives and were stopped on the 1 yard line on another, only to lose possession. On all of these drives it seemed like victory or at very least a tie would be achieved but they were stopped cold. One of the first half touchdowns was stopped deep in North Fondy territory on a pass interception on a questionable second down call.

Quarterback Kurt Urban scored on a one yard sneak for the Orioles' first TD in the second period and Greg Becker ran for the point. Becker also scampered 26 yards for a third quarter score but the extra point try failed.

Becker, converted from an end last season, provided most of the North Fondy running power, picking up 130 yards in 18 carries. Kewaskum, however, enjoyed a 326 to 249 advantage over the Orioles in total yardage.

Jim Manthei, who netted 131 yards in 17 carries for the Indians, raced 69 yards for a third quarter touchdown, breaking a couple of tackles en route. Kewaskum scored from 69 yards out but couldn't push it over from 1 and 4 yards out. Al Bohn gained 114 yards in 21 rushing attempts for second honors.

The game included numerous penalties, including 110 yards assessed against the Indians, and some of these were called at crucial times when Kewaskum was threatening. The Indians ended up with 13 first downs to 12 for the Orioles, with five of the latter coming on penalties.

The defensive efforts of Coach Joe Harlow's Indians included a fumble recovery by Russ Gavin and an interception by Perry Koth.

In other games Grafton's fourth straight victory gave them sole possession of first place as they handed Pewaukee its first defeat, 20-7. The win was a giant step toward Grafton's second straight conference championship. Germantown trounced Slinger for its first win, 25-0, and Random Lake tallied 12 points in the final period to trip Campbellsport, 19-13.

On Saturday in a 2 p. m. game Kewaskum plays at Germantown. The Warhawks are figured as a good opportunity for the Indians to gain their second win but after their 25-0 thumping of Slinger last week, the game rates as a toss-up now.

His car veered off the left side of the road and crashed into the southeast corner of the Edward Volm farm home, knocking out the wall of a den.

The auto came to rest after partially demolishing a wall of an adjacent utility room. Ogi, who said he fell asleep at the wheel, escaped injury. There were no occupants in the room at the time of the crash.

No estimate of damages was available. The left rear and front portion of the auto were damaged.
