## Bids for Expansion and Improvement Of Sewage Treatment Plant Opened

### Low Bids Total \$442,593, 10% Higher Than Anticipated

#### BOARD OKAYS PURCHASE OF USED TRUCK FOR FIRE DEPT.

Bids for expansion and improvement of the sewage treatment plant were opened at an adjourned village board meeting at 3 p. m. Monday. Apparent low bids totaled \$442,593 which is about ten per cent higher than was anticipated.

The treatment plant is presently overloaded because of increased industrial usage and population growth. New equipment will be installed to bring the level of treatment up to standards set by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

Westra Construction Co. of Waupun was apparent low bidder for general construction on a bid of \$407,950. There were 13 bids for that part of the project ranging up to \$514,780.

On a bid of \$24,510, Burckhardt Electric of West Bend was apparent low bidder for the electrical work. There were five bids ranging to \$34,860.

Apparent low bidder for heating and ventilating was R. P. Honold of Sheboygan on a bid of \$5,691. Four bids were received. High bid was \$7,168.

Among three bids for plumbing, Jos. Wittig Co., West Bend, had the apparent low with \$4,442. High bid was \$5,625.

Bids were opened by James Elder of Stone and Robinson, consulting engineers of Brookfield. He will study the bids and make his recommendations to the village board next month. Letting of bids will follow.

Originally the sewage plant was designed to handle 450,000 gallons of sewage per day but it is presently processing up to 600,000 gallons. When enlarged it will have a one million gallon per day capacity.

It is anticipated that as much as 80 per cent of the cost may be recovered through state and federal aids. The DNR has approved the village's application and it has been sent to the Chicago district office for formal approval.

However, such aids will not come through until the new installations get DNR approval. This could take as long as three years. Meanwhile, the village will have to borrow funds to finance the project.

In other action, the board authorized purchase of a used truck from the State of Wisconsin for use by the volunteer fire department. It will be equipped with a hose, reel and pump and will become an auxiliary fire truck.

Fire Chief Armin Oppermann reported he was notified that five trucks that were used by the conservation department were being offered for sale to area fire departments on a first-come, first-served basis. He said he and several other firemen looked at the trucks and after meeting with the

## Presents for Christmas Party At School Taken

A thief made off with all the Christmas presents to be exchanged by the students, as well as some for their teacher, at the Salem E and R Church of Christ at Wayne last Wednesday. The Wayne school is part of the Kewaskum school district and due to overcrowding the kindergarten classes are held in the church rooms. The theft, which occurred about 3:30 p. m., was reported to the county sheriff's department Thursday.

Richard Zarling, director of elementary education in the Kewaskum School District, reported Friday morning that the district would replace all the gifts so that the 17 kindergarten pupils were not disappointed and held their Christmas party Tuesday despite the theft. The gifts were not to exceed 50 cents in value but the sentimental value was the important thing.

Chief Deputy Allen Becker of the sheriff's department said they were seeking a man clad in a leather jacket, and a companion, both believed to be in their 20's, in connection with the theft. The man wearing the jacket was seen entering the church after a companion, driving a 1959 grey Chevrolet with a black vinyl top and two antennas on the rear, was seen dropping him off. The car then left, but returned shortly and picked up the jacket clad man who was "carrying a box" which turned out to be the children's gifts. The car then drove off.

The local school district leases a parish hall attached to the church for the kindergarten classes, which are taught by Mrs. Connie Zemlicka. Both Zarling and Becker reported that the church door was locked and it was not known how the thief opened it since no damage to the door was found.

## Carl Schaefer Dies Visiting In California

Carl F. Schaefer, 73, of 229 Forest Ave., Kewaskum, passed away unexpectedly Monday, Dec. 21, at the home of his son, Charles, in San Francisco, Calif. Mr. and Mrs. Schaefer had left last week to spend the holidays with their son and two daughters, all of whom reside in California.

Mr. Schaefer formerly operated a Ford agency and garage in Kewaskum for many years with his brother, the late Harry J. Schaefer. He held office many years as assessor of the Village of Kewaskum, in which capacity he was still serving, and was a former member of the Washington County Welfare Committee. Carl was a veteran of World War I and was very active in the American Legion, being a member of Robert G. Romaine Post 384 of Kewaskum. He was a past commander and vice-commander and had held most offices of the post, presently serving as adjutant and finance officer.

Funeral services were conducted at Carlmont Chapel in Belmont, Calif., Wednesday, Dec. 23, followed by cremation.

Memorial services will be held at Peace United Church of Christ, Kewaskum in late January.

### Indian Matmen Sixth in Kiel Invitational

#### LOSE TO KETTLE MORAINÉ AND MILWAUKEE JUNEAU

Kewaskum finished sixth out of eight teams at the Kiel Invitational Wrestling tournament held Saturday.

Results were: 1. Denmark, 94; 2. Appleton East, 90; 3. Sheboygan South, 43; 4. Kiel, 39; 5. West Bend West, 36; 6. Kewaskum, 35; 7. Oostburg, 20; 8. Howards Grove, 18.

Although the best they could do was sixth place, Kewaskum did come up with one champion in the Kiel meet. He was John Jadro, who finally won a championship at 119 pounds after placing second at four tournaments while wrestling with the high school squad. Jadro, who now has an 8-2 record, was awarded a medal for his victory. John defeated opponents from Appleton East, West Bend West and Kiel on his championship.

Doug Bindrich, at 155 pounds, also made it to the finals before losing to an Appleton wrestler. Before being defeated he eliminated the top-seeded wrestler in his weight class.

Other Kewaskum winning places were Doug Schacht, 145, third; Kim Rodenkirch, heavyweight, third; and George Muckerheide, 105, fourth. Schacht lost to a 1970 state meet performer in a close semi-final match. Rodenkirch bumped into the champ in the semi-finals and pinned his opponent to cop third place honors.

One of the Indian wrestlers failed to make weight, costing his team points and a possible higher finish.

The Kewaskum wrestlers had a busy weekend, also participating in matches Thursday and Friday night before competing in the Kiel Invitational Saturday.

#### KETTLE MORAINÉ 30, KEWASKUM 14

Kettle Moraine, a new school in the Scenic Moraine Conference,

which has a reputation as a wrestling power, defeated Kewaskum Thursday and defeated the Indians 30-14. Except for two close decisions, the match would have been closer.

Starting at 98 pounds, Steve Ruplinger lost the first bout, 2-1. Then Muckerheide and Cal Tackes won their bouts by decisions. But Jadro, one of the Indians' top wrestlers, was trounced 7-0. This tied the match at 6-6. However, the rest of the way Kewaskum was blanked until Schacht and Rodenkirch won the final two matches. Schacht suffered a torn ligament in his bout and will be out of action until after the holidays.


