## UWWC Announces student art contest winners

The University of Wisconsin-Washington County (UW-WC) is pleased to announce the names of the middle and high school students who took top awards in the 2015 student art contest. Twenty-nine schools entered artwork for the annual contest, with a total of 197 middle school entries and 156 high school entries. All of the artwork will be on display at the Festival of Arts which takes place on Saturday, April 18 from 10am to 4pm. The campus is located at 400 University Drive in West Bend. Admission is free.

Judging at the high school level was completed by Josh Lesniak, art professor at UW-WC and Graeme Reid, Director of Collections/Exhibitions at Wisconsin Museum of Art. At the middle school level, judges included Lynn Molenda, an art educator and coordinator of Wisconsin's Student Centered Learning in the Arts action research group, and Shawn Graff, Washington County Campus Foundation board member who also

serves as the Executive Director of the West Bend Friends of Sculpture. Emphasis was placed on creativity, composition, originality, and use of space and color. The five categories for both middle and high school included: Drawing, Painting, Photography and Digital Illustration, Collage and 3D.

"Best in Show" at the middle school level was awarded to Emily Groth, 8th grader at Slinger Middle School for her colorful painting of a crab on a sandy beach. Her art teacher is Gail Hefti. "Best in Show" at the high school level went to Joe Klosowski, a junior at Hartford Union School for self-portrait oil painting titled "Ode to Caravaggio." According to his art teacher, Jessica Mohagen, this was Klosowski's first oil painting and he was inspired by the Italian Baroque unit from his AP History class.

## Things stay the same after Spring Election

Incumbents claimed victory in races they received challenges in Tuesday's Spring Election. Town of Kewaskum Clerk Nancy Boden kept her seat while Kewaskum Board of Education members James Leister, Mark Sette and Craig Staffin will remain on the board.

Village of Kewaskum residents will receive a new village president after Andy Pesch filed for non candidacy and Trustee Kevin Scheunemann ran for the position unopposed. He received 440 votes.

Village Trustee incumbents James Hovland and David Spenner will be joined by write-in candidate James Wright. Spenner received 386 votes while Hovland received two less than that at 384. Wright received 44 votes.

On the Kewaskum Board of Education, Leister received 1249 votes, Sette received 1088 votes and Staffin garnered 1032 votes.

Challenger Bradley Petersen, with his first attempt at a political race received 978 votes. Timothy Ramthun who was voted off the board last year ran a write-in campaign and received 301 votes.

On the Town of Kewaskum Board Boden thwated another challenge attempt this year with 227 votes over Ashley Thull who received 60 votes.

Metalware, including iron, bronze, brass, pot metal, silver, silver plate.

Clocks, including mantel, hanging and figural.

Costume jewelry, including brooches, bracelets, earrings.

Musical Instruments, including string, wind and reed instruments.

Books.

Sports Memorabilia.

Excluded items: all weapons, including swords and knives (though folding knives with advertising are accepted); traps (like leg-hold); Nazi memorabilia; coins and paper money; fine jewelry, including precious gems; Beanie Babies.

Questions about objects not covered here can be submitted to Moran in advance to determine if they are appropriate.
