

Kewaskum Baseball Head Coach Mike Heisdorf Hits 100 Win Milestone

KEWASKUM BASEBALL

The Kewaskum Indians (16-4, 9-1) defeated the Cedarburg Bulldogs (7-11) by a score of 8-4 Saturday afternoon.

Kewaskum scored in the top of the first when Kingston Grisolono hit a triple to right center and Austin Reichel grounded out, each scoring one run. The Bulldogs tied it in the bottom half when Elliot Wells hit a sacrifice fly.

However, Everett Donath singled in one run in the next half inning to take the lead for good.

After a scoreless fourth inning, the Indians added three more runs in the top of the fifth on a two-run home run by Sam Ciriacks and an Andrew Reichert RBI single.

The final run of the game for Kewaskum came in the sixth inning on a Ciriacks RBI single.

Carter Unger got the win on the mound, going five innings, allowing two runs (one earned), while striking out five and walking one. Cole Loser finished out the final two innings, allowing a pair of runs and striking out one.

This week, the Indians have a loaded, five-game schedule. Monday was resumed against Campbellsport and Tuesday was at Winneconne. Thursday is home against Winneconne at 4:45 p.m., Friday is at Kiel at 4:30 p.m., and Saturday is at West Bend West at 1 p.m.

Campbellsport Village Board Reviews Development Plans and Road Construction

The Campbellsport Village Board held a regular meeting on Monday, May 12 at 6 p.m.

The Board reviewed a request to split 403 Allison Way into two lots that would be used for side-by-side homes.

Village residents that live near 403 Allison Way presented their concerns to the board. Many expressed that they were concerned with the proximity of the side-by-side homes to the pond. They also shared their concerns about having four families on the original lot size, when it was originally intended for one family.

The Board took the Planning Commission's recommendation and approved the lot to be split for two single-family homes, rather than two side-by-side homes.

The Board approved the MSA Change Order for Martin St. and Cherry St. Reconstruction. It was advised by the DNR that Martin Street should use ductile iron pipe on Martin Street to continue the use of ductile piping that was used on N Railroad Street. The piping that is set to be used for Cherry Street will remain PVC.

The Board approved a Class B liquor license application for Pan and Parlor LLC, DBA The Pan and Parlor, located at 128 E Main Street.

The next Campbellsport Village Board Meeting will be held on June 9, 2025 at 6 p.m.



Campbellsport School Musicians Perform at W.S.M.A. State Music Competition

On April 26, Campbellsport High School and Middle School musicians performed at UW-Oshkosh and UW-Milwaukee for the WSMA state music competition.

Ben Grede, Seamus Kahler, Ayrayan Meilahn, and Hunter Whitfield received a 1st rating for a percussion quartet.

Seamus Kahler received a 1st rating for a drum set solo.

Tryston Kober received a 1st rating for a cello solo.

Aubrey Cousert received a 2nd rating for a musical theater solo.

Daniel Jaimes-Perez received a 2nd rating for a trumpet solo.

Congratulations to all our state participants on a job well done, said a school staffer.

A special congratulation goes to Tryston Kober as he also received a WSMA Exemplary Performance Recognition Award. State adjudicators identify exceptional performances, first nominating performances during the day and then selecting the most outstanding among those nominated to receive the honor. Out of 4,397 events across all state competition sites, only 541 events were nominated for this award. Of the 541, only 205 finalists were selected. Of the 205 events awarded, Tryston's event was only one of six middle school students across the state to earn this award.

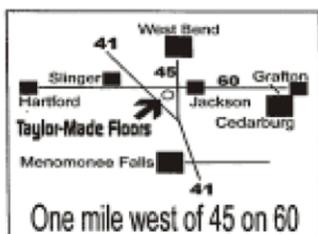

May 21, 2020

A River Celebration is planned for Saturday, June 27, from 3 to 7 p.m. at River Hill Park in Kewaskum. This free event will feature kayaking and canoeing on the Milwaukee River. Gitter Appointed Interim Library Director

Kewaskum Village Administrator Adam Gitter has been appointed interim library director of the Kewaskum Public Library while the Kewaskum Library Board searches for a permanent library director.

Lori Kreis resigned from the library director position on Monday, May 12. The Library Board met that day and sent a memo to the Kewaskum Village Board requesting that Gitter be appointed interim library director while the library board searched for a permanent library director.

The village board approved the appointment at its regular board meeting on Monday, May 19.

Kreis served as library director since 2018. When an interim director was needed before she was hired, two longtime library board members, Teresa Meltz and Connie Zemlicka, kept the library going.

Now, the library board has many new faces due to reappointments and resignations. Four of the seven board members were appointed this year.

According to last week's memo, the Library Board has formed a subcommittee to lead the recruitment of the next library director.

In addition to the interim appointment, the Library Board requested Gitter's support in facilitating a strategic planning process in collaboration with the Library Board. Strategic planning remains a prior-

ity for the library board as it strives to improve services at the new library location.

In 2024, the library moved to its new location at 1225 Fond du Lac Ave. The new library building offers about 15,000 square feet, compared to the 3,058 square feet the library had at its former site on First Street.

Likewise, the village police department and village administration moved into a new space this year. They now have about 23,150 square feet, compared to the approximate 8,247 square feet they had in the former village municipal building. The new building now meets compliance standards and offers space for storage and future needs.

Strategic planning objectives for the library may include:

- Enhancing community engagement and outreach.
- Expanding digital and educational resources.
- Strengthening youth and adult programming.
- Building strategic partnerships with local organizations and schools.
- Increasing accessibility and inclusivity across services.
- Establishing performance metrics and outcome-based evaluations.
- Developing a comprehensive fundraising strategy.
- Integrating grant writing as a key component of funding development and sustainability.

Village Board Approves Community Room Rental Beginning June 1

The Kewaskum Village Board held a regular meeting at 7 p.m. on May 19.

During the meeting, the board approved job descriptions for the library director position. The Library Board has begun recruiting for a new library director, with Village Administrator Adam Gitter appointed as interim director until the position is filled. A subcommittee has been formed by the Library Board to assist in the recruitment process.

The Community Room in Village Hall will be available for rental beginning June 1. The board voted to keep the facility rental rates unchanged. The space will remain free of charge for charitable groups within the Village of Kewaskum, government agencies, nonprofit organizations, recreational groups based in the village, and schools.

Rental rates for others will be \$80 for village residents on weekdays

and \$100 on weekends. For non-residents, the rates will be \$100 on weekdays and \$120 on weekends. The Kewaskum Annex Building will remain unavailable for rental as the village continues transitioning into the new building.

The board also approved financing for the purchase of a used police squad car. The Kewaskum Police Department typically purchases a new vehicle every two years but was unable to do so in 2022 due to Ford order cancellations. One of the department's squad cars is currently out of service, having already required about \$9,000 in repairs, with an estimated \$13,000 to \$14,000 more needed to diagnose and fix ongoing issues.

Police Chief Tom Bishop presented options to either lease or finance a used vehicle. The board approved financing the purchase of a used squad car for approximately \$63,000.

The next Village Board meeting is scheduled for 7 p.m. on June 2.



Volunteer Writers Tell Stories for Wisconsin's WWII Fallen

Currently, a statewide writer's group headed by Jean Coogle is telling stories of the state's World War II fallen service members. For the past three years her volunteers with "Stories Behind the Stars" have been researching, writing, and posting stories of the 8,600 fallen from Wisconsin. These memorial stories are posted on the veteran website *Fold3.com*. More than 2,300 of Wisconsin's WWII heroes have been remembered by these dedicated volunteer writers. Coogle is hoping to double her group of volunteer writers and complete the project soon. Many of her volunteers have strong patriotic and family bonds.

Navy veteran Jeff Veesenmeyer joined Stories Behind the Stars after researching and writing about his own family member. "My Uncle Louis was killed by a kamikaze at Okinawa in 1945. We were told he was buried at sea. Nobody in our family knew much more about how he died."

Through research Veesenmeyer was able to tell the story of a 95-minute air sea battle at Okinawa. Destroyer USS Hadley nearly sank after being hit by two bombs and four kamikazes. Thirty crewmembers were killed, 151 were wounded. His Uncle Louis had been manning a quad 40mm gun. The nine-man gun crew continued firing at a kamikaze plane until it crashed into their mount. The gun and all the men were blown out to sea. No remains for Louis were ever found. The action report listed the nine men on mount 44 as, "Outstanding in performance of duty." Veesenmeyer posted the story on a *Fold3.com* memorial.

"Now my family finally knew the story. They thanked me," recalled Veesenmeyer. "I knew I wanted to honor other service men and women the same way. I've told over a hundred stories like this one. And I've been thanked by many of their family members."



One response to a Stories Behind the Stars story was, "As my family's amateur genealogist, I was delighted to read about PFC Howard E. Penniston, Jr... These stories are to be treasured during our lifetimes so that people like PFC Howard E. Penniston, Jr. will never be forgotten."

This important project is part of a national non-profit organization called Stories Behind the Stars. The goal is to tell the stories of all 421,000 Americans who died during WWII. Their memorial stories are posted on *Fold3.com* and will be linked to a phone app. Grave site visitors will be able to scan the name on a headstone and read the fallen's story on their phone.

Jean Coogle is the Wisconsin WWII Fallen Project Director. She is looking for more help. Her goal is to complete the remaining 6,300 fallen from Wisconsin. But she needs more volunteers. "Eighty years ago, thousands of brave Wisconsin sons and daughters fought and died for our freedom. Telling stories for those who never could is very powerful," says Coogle. "They deserve to be

remembered." Coogle points out that volunteering is fairly easy. Writers work from home at their own pace. This could also be a group project for a history class, a historical society or genealogy project. A bonus benefit is the free access to research sites, *Fold3.com*, *Ancestry.com* and *Newspapers.com*. This three-site package would normally cost \$479.00 per year. But it is free to members who can also use it to search for data on their own families.
